

When is Awana?

Awana takes place at Centre Street Church - Central Campus on Thursday nights from 6:30pm to 8:00pm.

Dates: Sep. 21st - Dec. 7th, Jan. 11th - May 2nd.
Leader Training: Sep. 7th
Awards Night: May 9th

What is the cost of Awana?

Basic Registration Fee:

This is a yearly fee per child that helps cover the costs of running the program (includes awards, prizes and basic materials, etc)

- Infants and Toddlers: \$20
- Puggles (Age 2) \$25
- Cubbies (Age 4-5) \$45
- Sparks (Kindergarten to Gr. 2) \$60
- T&T (Gr. 3 to Gr. 6) \$70
- Trek (Gr. 7- Gr. 9) \$25
- Journey (Gr. 10- Gr. 12) \$25

Additional Material Fees:

There are additional costs for each child depending on the required materials needed for the child.

What are the registration requirements?

We desire for Awana at CSC to be part of our larger vision of mid-week discipleship opportunities for the entire family. In order to do this, there are registration/eligibility requirements. Please read carefully to see if you/your child are eligible.

Registration Requirements:

REQUIREMENT #1 -> You must attend CSC (2 exceptions below)

- If you are from another church, you must be signed-up for one of our mid-week discipleship programs running on Thursday night.
- All children who do not have a church home and are invited by a friend can come without a requirement of having to attend CSC.

REQUIREMENT #2 -> One of the following:

- An adult that attends CSC is signed up to volunteer weekly in Awana OR
- A parent that attends or volunteers in a mid-week discipleship program running on Thursday night

What is Awana?

Awana is a place for kids to learn and grow in their relationship with God through intentional discipleship materials and scripture memorization. It is an exciting opportunity for them to make new friends, play exciting games, receive awards for their achievements, and connect meaningfully with one another, their leader and God.

Awana stands for "Approved Workmen Are Not Ashamed" and is taken from 2 Timothy 2:15.

The Awana program encourages children to experience God by learning His word in a regular and systematic manner. Each group has age-appropriate handbooks for you and your child to work through together. Children are rewarded for remembering God's Word, as they recite their verses with their leaders on a weekly basis.

What are the different clubs at Awana?

INFANTS AND TODDLERS (babies and comfortably walking):

These rooms are filled with an amazing team of adults ready to love and care for your precious little one. Your child will engage in a simple Bible lesson, sing worship songs, and be prayed for. We want our Infants/Toddlers to know:

- God Made Me
- God Loves Me
- Jesus wants to be my friend forever

PUGGLES (Age 2)

Children engage in a great evening filled with play time, songs, an age appropriate Bible lesson, a simple craft/colouring page and a snack. Puggles reinforce four basic Biblical principles:

- God made everything
- God saw that it was good
- God is love
- Give thanks



CUBBIES (Ages 3 - 5)



Using a combination of stories, crafts, and other activities, children have a great time where fun and learning God's Word go hand-in-hand. Covering both Old and New Testaments, lessons focus on the characteristics of God and the core truth that God is Creator, helping Cubbies grow in their respect for God.

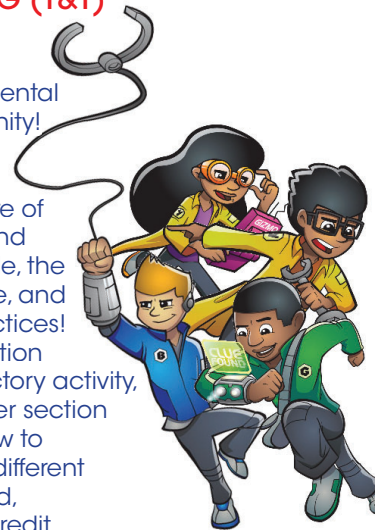
SPARKS (Kindergarten to Grade 2)

Sparks learn God's love and the foundation of His plan for salvation. By studying the major characters of the Old and New Testaments, Sparks begin to see how the entire Bible fits together in chronological order and God's amazing plan for them and to redeem all things.



TRUTH & TRAINING (T&T) (Grades 3 - 6)

T&T kids will explore some of the fundamental doctrines of Christianity! They will spend time learning about the character and nature of God, the structure and sequence of the Bible, the redemption narrative, and key discipleship practices! Each handbook section includes an introductory activity, a Bible study, a prayer section guiding them on how to specifically pray for different countries in the world, and optional extra credit opportunities to dive deeper in their Scripture memory and study of God's Word. Kids will also be challenged to memorize the books of the Bible, and to bring a friend.



TREK (Grade 7 to 9)

Trek books challenge students to wrestle with the three most important questions they are asking in junior high...Who am I? Why am I here? Who's with me?

At the beginning of the evening, students will have a time of teaching where they will get to discuss and ask questions of their leaders based on the work they've done in their books each week. They will then volunteer in one of the other clubs and serve for the rest of the evening.

JOURNEY (Grade 10 to 12)

Journey establishes high school students as lifelong disciples through a deep study of God's Word, mobilizing them to live with a godly perspective and an evident faith. At the beginning of the evening, students will have a time of teaching where they will get to discuss and ask questions of their leaders based on the work they've done in their books each week. They will then volunteer in one of the other clubs and serve for the rest of the evening.

WHAT HAPPENS AT AWANA?

Awana is a great place for kids to have fun and build community mid-week. There are three key pieces to the night:

- **Large Group Time:** Kids come together to hear a Bible story, sing songs, and pray together.
- **Activity Time:** Team games is a great opportunity to get some energy out through fun games that teach and encourage cooperation, team work, and good sportsmanship.
- **Handbook Time (small group):** This is where small groups of kids come together with their leader to share what they learned that week, complete parts of their handbooks, memorize and recite scripture, and receive any awards they have earned for completing sections in their handbooks.
